## **REPORTS**

## Chairperson

The Cilgerran Festival Week, as one can imagine, takes a lot of the Chairman's time.

The money donated from the Coracle Society to Cilgerran was much appreciated which was used, as discussed, to buy 4 fibre coracles which can be used at various shows, events and exhibitions. They work really well and saves a lot of time for everyone. A great benefit to Cilgerran and will see more pupils using them in the Schools. Arrowcraft moulded the coracles and copied every detail – not a traditional seat but looks good. A bit heavier than a normal coracle but everyone is happy.

Fishing – more restrictions have been imposed on them by Natural Resources Wales which have curtailed their season from 5 to 3 months. Hard to keep the tradition going. Tywi license is £500.00 and Teifi license £250.00 a season

In past years every fisherman would have had their own outlet to sell their fish. Salmon population across the world heavily depleted due to climate change, pollution and too much fishing. Lot of sea trout suffering due to this.

#### Treasurer

The 2018 accounts were presented for approval. Slightly more expenditure this year due to the money given to the Teifi Association for the fibreglass coracles.

The coracle insurance is of good value for what the Society receives and should be retained. The Society nearly had a claim against us from an incident at England's Medieval Festival. The cause of the incident was the participant not listening to advice given to her and falling into the water.

National Coracle Centre

Jude mentions that Pitchford Hall is on a mission to acquire every coracle that has been used on British water.

Tywi - Doing a lot of good work promoting the coracles in schools through their Carmarthen Town History and Trail. Plenty of interest

*Ironbridge Coracle Trust* 

The last coracle shed in England has had a huge local impact with many local people gaining interest in coracles. The Trust is continually finding more information. The shed is now empty but back in 2004 when Eustice was there it was full of artefacts and loads of photographs.

The Pepper's Ghost effect – make an exhibition in an empty shed. Similar in effect to the Mary Rose experience – seeing images appear and pictures lightening up.

90% of the contents were found and brought back. The collection now is in boxes (frozen first to get rid of any wood worm) and stored in the Iron Gauge Museum. The objects were all photographed – lovely collection of netting needles.

Grant funding here at the Centre which is safer. They can do illustrating stories and social history of Ironbridge – bringing history back to life. There are plenty of photographs of coracles and river life. All this will be part of the Museum Coracle Trail.

They have funding for a sculpture of a coracle – bronze? The history of the coracle in the area is still prominent. To be finished in 2 weeks time. There will be a free exhibition with plenty of images and replicas of the old shed.

The Arts Council Money to be used in telling the local stories for example Eustace telling stories and meeting Tommy. Will be fun for the kids and also there will be information on how to use the nets etc.

New information is constantly been discovered. Courses will be done here – the use of wood here in Greenwood. There will be an Artist's and children's workshop.

Plenty of souvenirs and also a memory map of Ironbridge.

Soft opening on December 7<sup>th</sup> 2019. The old shed and complete project open 2020
